


# Scottish Obstetric Cardiology National Managed Clinical Network



## **ANNUAL REPORT 2020/21**

#### **Background**

SOCN was established on 1 September 2018 in response to the MBRRACE-UK report, "Saving Lives, Improving Mothers' Care", published in December 2016, which highlighted that cardiac disease remains the leading indirect cause of death in pregnancy.

The network facilitates clinical and other improvements in the area of obstetric cardiology through delivery of objectives set by the National Specialist Services Committee (NSSC) for NHS Boards and SGHSCD within the national commissioning process. The network encompasses care for women who either have a pre-existing cardiac condition before pregnancy or go on to develop cardiac conditions during pregnancy.

The development of pathways, guidelines and documentation to support the delivery of services that are evidence based has been prioritised by the network. This will improve outcomes for women with cardiac disease and support implementation of optimal care to any women with a cardiac condition who is contemplating a pregnancy or has a pregnancy in Scotland.

Facilitating collaboration within and across the multi-disciplinary teams involved in a woman's care at local, regional and national levels is a key goal of the network. This work is being supported through the development of a data set and data collection programme to identify areas for improvement.

#### **Current position**

Understandably NHS Scotland priority during 2020/21 has been to respond to and deal with COVID-19 impact and this has seen clinical and other resource diverted from network activity which resulted in fewer Steering Group and Sub-Group meetings.

The network progressed the majority of workplan objectives. However due to clinician capacity a number are taking longer to complete than expected due to the ongoing COVID-19 pandemic. A full work plan update is available on page 6.


The network will continue to host meetings and events virtually in line with NSS guidance and, as soon as restrictions allow, will aim to hold one face to face steering group meeting per year and move the annual symposium back to an in person event. This will facilitate the informal networking that is critical to the development of a cohesive and supportive clinical community.

#### **Highlights**

Mapping & Data Gathering Meetings: To advise the network's understanding of local obstetric cardiology service provision, mapping and data gathering visits/meetings were undertaken with the wider local multidisciplinary teams. Delays were experienced in finalising visits due to the pandemic and clinician availability however these are now complete. Service mapping will provide the basis for improvements in how healthcare professionals co-ordinate care and communicate with each other, and will support development of agreed standards, competencies and guidance for health care staff. The network was participating in a review of the cardiac services and planned to use this as an initial opportunity to influence and inform service models and planning, however the

review is currently paused. The network will engage with local and regional planning as required.

**SOCN Symposium:** SOCN held its 2<sup>nd</sup> Symposium on 2 October 2020 via MS Teams. The event was attended by 160 delegates from a range of specialties including Obstetrics, Cardiology, Anaesthetics and Midwifery. 79 delegates took the opportunity to complete and return their evaluation.




Other educational opportunities included a Case Discussion meeting hosted by NHS Tayside and NHS Grampian on 4 December attended by 51 delegates.

#### **Communication and Engagement**


Awareness Raising & Stakeholder Engagement: The patient forum has developed a 'what matters to me' document which was presented by them via a recording at the annual symposium. Forum members have provided feedback on the website and development of patient information. Feedback from the patent forum has also been used to inform discussion at sub-group meetings and the workplan objectives for SOCN are capturing the issues highlighted by forum members including communication, education, recognition and inequity of access.

**Women's Health Plan:** The 2019-20 Programme for Government in Scotland committed to the development of a Women's Health Plan (WHP) to tackle health inequalities including those related to heart disease. SOCN's Lead Clinician is a member of the WHP Steering Group and chairs the 'Heart Health' subgroup. Engagement also continues with third sector organisations such as the British Heart Foundation, Little Hearts Matter and Cardiomyopathy UK. Several members of the SOCN Steering Group and subgroups continue to present at local, regional and national events to improve awareness and education of heart disease in pregnancy.

**Social Media:** SOCN has an active twitter account @S\_O\_C\_N and facilitates one of the largest engagements available in this specialist area.



**Website:** Website analytics are now available for the SOCN website and will provide a baseline for future reporting.



#### **Exceptions**

**SpR Education Event:** Due to the COVID crisis the training event planned for May 2020 was cancelled. Registrars of various specialties attended the annual symposium as well as the Case Discussion meetings held during the course of the year.

**Network Review:** The joint review of SOCN network with Paediatric & Adult Congenital Heart Disease Services has been paused.

**Audit & Data Collection:** The SOCN Clinical Audit System (CAS) instance was finalised in August 2020. Further roll out was paused due to the pandemic and discussions around the use of Power Apps. After pulling together a requirements paper around the rationale for a Power App, the Information Management Services agreed there was a clear basis for designing a database specific to the network's needs. This means that specific information can be collected through the app which may have been difficult for the CAS to accommodate. NSS's Digital and Security Team (DaS) have scheduled time in 2021/22 to develop a power app for the network with development commencing in August 2021.

#### **Looking forward**

**Lead Clinician:** Maggie Simpson's tenure as Lead Clinician has been extended until March 2022. The network will commence a recruitment process during 2021/22.

The 2021/22 SOCN programme of work will focus on finalising the guideline and pathway workstreams. This will include documenting current pathways for women across Scotland and the development of a service model.

**Education** will also continue to be a focus for the network with objectives to:

- Host 2021 SOCN Symposium
- Ongoing case discussion meetings
- Scope development of an online 'heart disease in pregnancy' module for healthcare professionals
- Animation to support heart disease in pregnancy leaflets

**Development of SOCN Power App:** The network plans to work with the Information Management Service to create a SOCN Power App to progress the collection and use of data to identify areas for improvement.

#### **Finance**

The network has not incurred any costs during the reporting period due to the planned symposium taking place on a virtual platform.

#### **SOCN WORKPLAN – 2020-21**

When defining network objectives please consider the Institute of Medicine's six dimensions of quality, which are central to NHS Scotland's approach to systems-based healthcare quality improvement:

- 1. **Person-centred**: providing care that is responsive to individual personal preferences, needs and values and assuring that patient values guide all clinical decisions;
- 2. **Safe**: avoiding injuries to patients from healthcare that is intended to help them;
- 3. Effective: providing services based on scientific knowledge;
- 4. Efficient: avoiding waste, including waste of equipment, supplies, ideas, and energy;
- **5. Equitable**: providing care that does not vary in quality because of personal characteristics such as gender, ethnicity, geographic location or socio-economic status; and
- 6. **Timely**: reducing waits and sometimes harmful delays for both those who receive care and those who give care.
